Frequently Asked Question...

Should I appoint a monitor in my Representation Agreement?

There are many benefits to appointing a monitor in your Representation Agreement but whether you should appoint one depends on your situation and what's right for you.

Here are some things you might want to consider when deciding if a monitor is right for you. For example, are you planning on including routine management of financial matters in your Representation Agreement? If so, an extra safeguard is required and appointing a monitor is one way to satisfy this requirement. Alternatively, you can appoint two or more representatives to act jointly but this can present problems if they do not live close to one another. A monitor gives more flexibility while offering an independent safeguard.

Even if you are not including financial authority in your Representation Agreement, the monitor has other important benefits. CanadaHelps.org is a registered charity that allows people to safely donate online to any registered Canadian charity and provides accessible and easy to use online technology to both donors and charities.

CanadaHelps.org allows you to make a personal donation or contribute in memory of a family member or friend. You also have the option to set up automatic monthly donations.

Nidus does not receive any ongoing funding to pay for operating costs such as phone, rent, printing and the staff who provide the personalized service we are known for. Nidus depends on donors like you to help us continue to provide information and education on Representation Agreements and other personal planning related matters.

Direct Funding is one of the funding options offered by Community Living British Columbia (CLBC) to qualifying individuals with special needs. Direct Funding allows individuals and their families to arrange and manage the services and aids required to meet disability-related needs.

Personal Planning:

[Pur-suh-nl plan-ing] verb – the act of making one or more legal documents that authorize your personal supporters to help you manage your affairs or make decisions on your behalf if you need assistance due to illness, injury or disability: Carla is gathering information about personal planning because she is aging and concerned about maintaining her independence.

Personal planning is different from estate planning in that personal planning is about making arrangements for while you are alive, whereas estate planning is about making arrangements for when you die.
